This proposal requests funding to support Per Diem and Transportation for 25 students from the CD 479- Policy Analysis and Advocacy course to travel to lobby days in Sacramento, California.

The Policy Analysis and Advocacy course is a capstone course that analyzes public and private policies affecting families. Many of the students enrolled in the course are at senior level, preparing to graduate with a degree in Child Development and entering the fields of Social Work, Education, Psychology, etc. This 3-day policy and advocacy trip provides students with the opportunity to integrate knowledge from this course, as well as from their overall undergraduate education.

Since the policy and advocacy trip has been a re-occurring event, the instructor of the course had designed this instructionally related activity as a critical component of the pedagogy. Throughout the semester, students are exposed to guest presentations on how to meet with legislators, for local Senate District representatives, and on how to deliver effective advocacy messages. They are produce policy briefs on issues currently being considered in the California Legislature. The trip to Sacramento provides students with hands-on experience in speaking before legislative committees, meeting with legislators and with legislative staff, and understanding how to use the resources available to child advocates engaged in the state's political process. Past trips have demonstrated to students their ability to speak effectively to our elected leaders and policymakers; they speak about the trip as a life-changing experience that has been empowering and enlightening. It has become a cornerstone of the learning experience in our Policy Analysis and Advocacy course.

2. How does your program meet all the General Requirements listed in #2 of the IRA Funding Guidelines? If the IRA Program no longer has a course title and number, please explain why it should still be eligible for IRA funding. Students participating in this activity are all enrolled in CD 47- Policy Analysis and Advocacy and are consequently currently enrolled at HSU. The activity is directly related to instruction of the CD 479 course. This activity occurs during the fiscal year and no salaries or wages will be funded. Per Diem is being requested for 25 students at \$70 each.

3. What is the instructor's level of participation in this IRA funded course and activity?

The instructor participates in all aspects of the policy and advocacy trip. In addition, the instructor facilitates discussion after each Senate Committee Meeting attended. Furthermore, experiences from the activity are further discussed and implemented in to classroom activities for the rest of the semester.
