This proposal requests funding to cover the associated fees for 72 students enrolled in CD 257 (Supervised Work with Children I) and CD 358 (Supervised Work with Children II) in 2017-2018. Actively following the regulation of the California Community Care Licensing (CCCL) and the standards by the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC), students are required to provide evidences of several records (e.g., tuberculosis (TB) test clearance, pertussis (Whooping cough) vaccination). Students in advanced course (i.e., CD 358) are highly recommended to have certification of pediatric First aid/CPR. These requirements will support the effort to create and maintain a safe and healthy environment for young children and college students in the Child Development Lab.

This activity clearly benefits participating students, the Child Development Lab, the Child Development Department, and the overall HSU culture and educational standards. The enrolled students in CD 257 and CD 358 participate in hands-on learning of building relationships and communication skills as a foundation for guidance of young children. In this course, students learn how to create safe and healthy learning environments in a group setting through participating in weekly seminars and lab activities. Lab activities include developing and implementing early childhood curriculum, observing young children in a natural environment, providing developmentally and culturally appropriate guidance, and facilitating constructive learning opportunities. AS one of core classes in the Child Development Department, CD 257 serves a foundation for learning and applying knowledge of child development. CD 358 is advanced course for those who are pursuing a teaching career in early childhood, elementary education, and special education. With successful completion of these courses, students will:

The students who are enrolled in CD 257 and CD 358 will be funded. These activities will occur during the fiscal year, which the funds are allocated. In the beginning of each semester, enrolled students will be instructed to obtain records of TB test clearance and whooping cough immunization. Those who are in CD 358 will be instructed to obtain pediatric First aid/CPR.

The instructor will provide enrolled students the professional guideline for working with young children including health and safety requirement. The instructor will also ensure keeping all of the records with the support of CDL staff as proper documentation is a part of the state regulation and the national standard.
