1. Please describe the nature and objective of your activity and how it qualifies as an Instructionally Related Activity (IRA). Forestry Conclave provides students opportunities in leadership as club officers or non-officer duties such as organizing class related activities and events. Exposes students to other forestry students and programs in the west when attending a fall season competition each year - usually California Conclave hosted by Cal Poly University at Swanton Ranch. Exposes students to hands on, practical skills related to their primary educational focus. Student participation in Forestry Conclave allows them to become more familiar with historical and contemporary timber harvesting and timber management practices in other locals. Students participate in technical events that require them to use knowledge and skills acquired in prior classroom and field experience. The actual conclave competition participation involves students in a variety of athletic events that tests their skill in the effective and safe use of tools basic to the profession of forestry. Forestry Conclave is open to all students on the HSU campus and several of the members have been students in majors other than Forestry. Usually about one-quarter to one-third of the students enrolled are female. Enrollment fluctuates depending upon the location of the fall competition and the hardship of a long weekend away for the competition and associated travels. Competitions such as the Forestry Conclave event have been occurring on and off campus since near the beginning of the program.

Students learn leadership skills, willingness to be part of a team, organizational skills in time and place at training events and competition, and ability to discover new or latent abilities within themselves.

2. How does your program meet all the General Requirements listed in #2 of the IRA Funding Guidelines?

Forestry Conclave proves to be an excellent tool for the retention of students in forestry and other programs and HSU as a whole. This class is still offered in the FWR Department.

3. What is the instructor's level of participation in this IRA funded course and activity?

Forestry Conclave meets every other week for a 1-hour officers meeting and a 1-hour classroom meeting. In addition the class participates in an average of 3-4 hours of practice and work at the Conclave Practice Field located at Freshwater Forest each weekend. The faculty attends all of the officers meetings, the classroom meetings and all practice events. The faculty course instructor attends all events that require travel.
